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My Dear Neighbors,

Hello, Fall! Falling leaves are coming soon.

It is very enjoyable getting a little break in the weather! It is now pumpkin time once again.

I know that reading our Covenants and Rules of the HOA are probably one of the tasks no one enjoys. One item I would like to highlight this month is that our subdivision lays on a "River Corridor". This is best described by a 2,000-foot buffer along the Chattahoochee River. (There is a map available in back of the Architectural Rules & Regulations on our website for your reference). This protected land is governed by the Atlanta Regional Commission. Those who have property in this buffer area must follow stricter guidelines in any changes or improvement to their property. Plans must first be approved by the City of Johns Creek and then submitted to the HOA for approval. So those living in that Corridor plan ahead since it will take perhaps a week or two extra for obtaining approval.

The trimming of the bushes and trimming the trees in the park area is close to completion. We need to have some brush removed that is next to the stream. That should be completed shortly.

A very important meeting is scheduled for Wednesday November 6, 2024, at 7:00PM at the Club in the ballroom. It is the joint meeting with the Club and HOA on the plan for Deer reduction in our neighborhood. Folks on both boards have spent a year working on a solution to this problem. To determine if we had a problem with deer and then what we can legally do about it, the joint committee reached out to the Federally controlled USDA Wildlife Services and also our state Dept. of Natural Resources (DNR). They conducted a study which provided us with the facts and ways to approach the thinning of the deer population. We are most concerned about the disease deer bring and also the attraction of coyote's that deer population draw. We have been sending e-blasts

out and even a letter was placed in your mailbox. So please come to the live meeting to learn more and get your questions answered.

Here is an updated status on our new website and our financial accounting system Dozens of hours are being graciously spent on this project. I would like to thank our Board members that are volunteering their valuable time for all of us to enjoy a much better communication device. We are breaking down our Rules & Regulations into 5 basic categories. This will then have a search capability so you can click to the information quickly. For example, you bought a golf cart and need to know what to do. You would just type <golf cart> then click enter and the information should pop up for your easy reference. We will be able to send out invoices to pay your dues via the system. This year you will still get paper as well as electronic invoices. This way you can transition at your chosen speed. The Board is getting excited to get this completed and in your hands.

One last item. The Board serves you, our fellow Homeowners. During the course of business, we have discussed many practices, policies and procedures. Our goal is to make them more transparent and easier on everyone. Shortly we will be sending some surveys out. I ask all of you to provide us with your thoughts and recommendations. The more surveys that are filled out by you, the more we get a pulse of what you would like and how we can serve you better. So, in advance I would like to say thank you for participating.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES:

Widening of MGinnis Ferry Road from Sargent Road to Union Hill: In 2020, an agreement was made with Alpharetta and Forsyth County to widen the road from 2 to 4 thru lanes. Agreed upon funding from all parties (\$8.9M from Johns Creek) was not enough to cover the received bids. Each party was asked to consider what additional funding could be added to the project. In 2023, City of Johns Creek determined they

could provide an additional \$3M for the project. In September of 2024, GDOT has increased their portion from \$10M to \$20M. The project will take 4 years and does not include any aesthetic upgrades or sound abatement. Approved IGA on September 9, 2024.

Town Center Development: Lakeside Drive in Tech Park is planned to be the city center main street, The city recently purchased a 5.75 acre piece of land for \$5.6 M. No discussion on what might be developed on the land.

Town Center Pedestrian Tunnel

crossing under 141: Council discussion regarding construction details. Tunnel bid is \$7.6M – paid for by TSPLOST II funds. Council requested more information/pricing following their discussion. More to come before project is finalized.

Autry Mill Nature Preserve Hiking

Trail: Visitors to the Autry Mill Nature Preserve can now enjoy a new 1.07 mile hiking trail. The path through the forest is shaded and features new foot bridges, trail signage and small boardwalks.

TOPIC: Deer Management in St Ives CC

Pat and Emily will be discussing the proposed plan, in more detail, on addressing the overpopulation of deer in our community through a culling program.

A cull will be conducted in February, 2025. All sites, other than one, will be on the golf course, and have been verified for safety. USDA marksmen will utilize suppressed rifles to reduce any noise impact to the adjoining neighbors.

All homeowners are encouraged to attend this meeting to learn about the plan, ask questions and address any concerns.

FROM THE BOARD

Greetings neighbors,

Happy Autumn and thank you for your patience as we continue to work on important security matters. I hope that you feel engaged and that your opinion as a resident of St. Ives is being considered. When I joined the Board, I promised that I would make it a priority to reach out more so than in the past, and that important decisions would be given the full transparency they deserved.

To this end, I wanted to report the conclusions of a recent focused outreach effort pertaining to traffic safety in one of our front-of-the-neighborhood pods. We engaged the neighbors living in the Wild Dunes pod (Wild Dunes and all connecting streets up to the Parkway). Neighbors were asked about their ideas on certain traffic safety proposals (i.e., speedbumps). Conclusively, a majority of residents did not want any additional speedbumps installed. We continue to work on other ideas to improve safety in this area, including increasing patrols. Of note, we looked at this pod in response to an invitation by a group of residents. If you feel that your pod needs to be evaluated for anything related to safety, I encourage you to discuss with your neighbors and reach out.

Along the same theme, I will be reaching out to the entire neighborhood concerning out-of-town checks. For no fee, you can currently have our security guards check on your house while you are away for up to three weeks (with a nominal charge after that). Guards will perform this service multiple times a day. We'd like to better understand the value proposition of this service (how often it is used, what is the pattern of usage, and what is the cost to us). Please be on the lookout for this communique and respond if you can.

I am happy to report on some other security-related updates. I and sure you have noticed the new padding on all the gate arms. Pads are marked with the words "Caution-No Tailgating." These serve multiple purposes, including:

 Protecting the gate arms (to some extent) from damage during an impact,

- Protecting automobiles (to some extent) from damage during an impact,
- Notifying drivers of the obvious not to tailgate through an open gate, and
- Encouraging careful driving, as drivers' eyes will be drawn to the words (and hopefully, therefore realize there's a gate in front of them)

I will audit the rate of gate impacts and damage assessments since these pads were installed, and report to you later.

I want to thank everyone for paying attention to parking and standing regulations when waiting for the school bus dropoffs. As a reminder, it is both unlawful and unsafe to sit all the way at the corner while in your car OR golf cart. Doing so makes traffic flow through those intersections much more dangerous, which is exactly what we don't need with schoolaged children around. Richard and the security guards will be out enforcing this regulation with some frequency.

Finally, I did want to bring up a topic that is a personal project of my own. As someone who lives very close to the Country Club gate, I witness the enormous amount of traffic that approaches this gate from both sides. The popular navigation systems (Waze, Google Maps, Apple Maps) and the services that rely on these navigation programs (Uber, UberEats, GrubHub, etc.) sometimes route traffic into the neighborhood through the club gate. There is a way to provide feedback to these navigation systems, and I have been doing this for some time. Unfortunately, the problem persists. I will continue to work on this, and if anyone has the inclination to provide feedback to Waze, Google or Apple, please reach out to me and I can walk you through it. Correcting this will not only ensure that our visitors and contractors get to the right place but will also decrease unneeded traffic and minimize the potential for gate impacts.


Children will line up to march in the costume parade around the cul-de-sac. There will be prizes for best costumes!


CHARITY GUILD FALL KICK-OFF MEE
